Objective of the Event	To introduce students to the concept of community-oriented policing and to emphasize the importance of collaboration between the police force and the community in reducing crime and promoting social harmony.
Description of the event	The Community Police Faculty Programme was organized by the Department of History at Government Degree College for Men, Srikakulam, on September 28, 2019. The event aimed to educate students about community-oriented policing (COP), a strategy that focuses on developing relationships between the police and community members to collaboratively address local issues. The guests emphasized that community policing goes beyond traditional law enforcement by engaging with local agencies and community members to address the root causes of crime. The Principal, Dr. M. Babu Rao, actively participated in the event, underscoring the importance of community policing in fostering

He highlighted the role of students in supporting such initiatives and encouraged them to be proactive in contributing to their community's well-being. The event concluded with an interactive session where students had the opportunity to ask questions and discuss the practical implications of community policing in their own neighborhoods.
