Objective of the Event	To raise awareness about the importance of literacy as a fundamental human right and to encourage students to reflect on the role of literacy in fostering a culture of peace, equality, and global citizenship.

Description of the event

The Essay Writing Competition on World Literacy Day was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Government Degree College for Men, Srikakulam, on 08.09.2018 at 11:00 A.M. in Room No. 36. The event saw the participation of 16 students who were tasked with writing a 500-word essay within 30 minutes.

Following the competition, Dr. N.S.N. Swamy, the IQAC Coordinator and organizer of the event, addressed the students. He emphasized that literacy is a fundamental human right that paves the way for the enjoyment of other human rights, greater freedoms, and global citizenship. Dr. Swamy highlighted that literacy is essential for acquiring broader knowledge, skills, and values that contribute to fostering a culture of lasting peace based on respect for equality, non-discrimination, and justice. He also informed the students that, despite progress, in 2022, at least one out of seven adults aged 15 and above (approximately 765 million) still lacked basic literacy skills, underscoring the ongoing need to prioritize literacy.

Outcome of the Event

The event successfully raised awareness among students about the critical importance of literacy in promoting human rights, equality, and global citizenship. Students gained a deeper understanding of the role literacy plays in building a peaceful and just society.
